We believe *everyone* deserves the opportunity to access the connectivity they need.

That's why we're pleased to participate in the Lifeline program to offer a discount on broadband and phone services for qualifying households.

Federal Lifeline

Through Lifeline, eligible Cookson Hills Connect customers can receive one of the two discounts listed below.

\$9.25 off the monthly cost of broadband only or broadband and phone packages.

\$5.25 off the monthly cost of phone only packages.

How to Qualify (Subject to Change):

- Participate in SNAP, Medicaid or other Federal Assistance Programs including Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Federal Public Housing Assistance (FPHA), or Veterans Pension and Survivors Benefit.
- Household income of 135% or less than Federal Poverty Guidelines.
- Have a child or dependent participating in any of the programs listed above.

Enhanced Lifeline for Tribal Lands

If you live on Tribal Lands, eligible Cookson Hills Connect customers can receive a discount of up to **\$34.25** off the monthly cost of broadband only, phone only or broadband and phone packages, and up to a **\$100** one-time discount on connection charges.

How to Qualify:

Live on federally recognized Tribal lands and:

- Participate in SNAP, Medicaid or other Federal Assistance Programs including Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Federal Public Housing Assistance (FPHA), or Veterans Pension and Survivors Benefit.
- Household income of 135% or less than Federal Poverty Guidelines.
- Participate in Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance, Head Start, Tribal TANF, or Food Distribution Program.
